Clothing Dress Code for Summer Camp

- Bathing suits must be modest one piece for females and bathing trunks for males (no Speedo style). Camp staff, deans and volunteers will have the final decision determining the appropriateness of any suit worn by either gender, reserving the right to require any camper or volunteer or staff member to wear a t-shirt with the swimsuit. *(Asking a camper or adult to add a t-shirt will be done with grace and firmness.)*
- All campers should bring 2 pairs of comfortable shoes to camp. Preferred footwear shall be closed, laced shoes. Sturdy outdoor sandals or Teva style footwear are permitted in casual or less strenuous activities. Flip flops are permitted only in lodging areas, showers, and pool areas. All camps have walking places that may include small depressions and holes. Sprained or broken ankles are not fun!
- Sturdy shoes and socks or riding boots are essential for horse and pony campers.
- Shoes for adventure activities need to be laced, closed shoes, or hiking boots.
- In keeping with the Christian atmosphere at camp, all clothing should be modest. Such things as belly shirts, very low-rise jeans, pants, and shorts for females (*meaning no bare midriff*), and extremely baggy pants, jeans or shorts on males (*meaning no pants that are meant to fall off from the waist*) are restricted. In most cases a t-shirt on top of the clothing will make the "outfit" acceptably modest. *(Asking a camper or adult to add a t-shirt must be done with grace and firmness.)*
